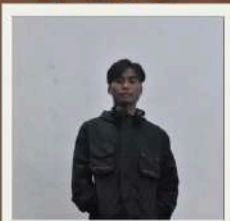

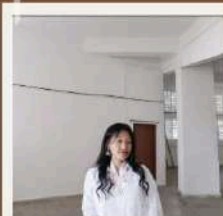

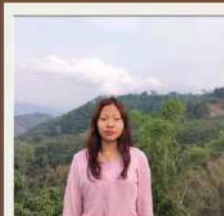

ST. CLARE SCHOOL'S WORLD ENVIRONMENT DAY 2025: A CELEBRATION OF GREEN COMMITMENT

ST. CLARE SCHOOL OBSERVES INTERNATIONAL YOGA DAY WITH ENTHUSIASM

St. Clare School, Akuluto joined the rest of the world in celebrating International Yoga Day on June 21, 2025, with great enthusiasm by organizing a special yoga session for students of Classes 7 to 10 in the school auditorium. The session was led by Sir Krishna Panika, who conducted the program with energy and clarity, leaving students physically refreshed and mentally uplifted. Observed worldwide since its initiation by the United Nations in 2015, the International Day of Yoga aims to spread awareness about the numerous benefits of yoga, and true to this spirit, the school used the occasion to promote physical well-being, mental peace, and spiritual discipline.

The event began with a brief introduction on the importance of yoga in daily life, especially in today's fast-paced world marked by stress, anxiety, and sedentary habits. Sir Krishna then demonstrated simple breathing exercises (pranayama), explaining their role in calming the mind and improving lung capacity, followed by a guided practice of various yoga asanas such as Tadasana, Vrikshasana, Bhujangasana, Trikonasana, and Shavasana, with detailed explanations of their benefits including better posture, digestion, muscle strength, and relaxation. Students followed the instructions attentively and performed the postures with discipline and enthusiasm. A key highlight of the session was the interactive explanation of the connection between breath, mind, and movement, during which Sir Krishna emphasized that yoga is not merely physical exercise but a holistic practice for a healthy life, encouraging students to devote at least 15 minutes daily to yoga. Through this meaningful observance, St. Clare School not only aligned itself with a global initiative but also reaffirmed its commitment to nurturing healthy minds and bodies among its students.

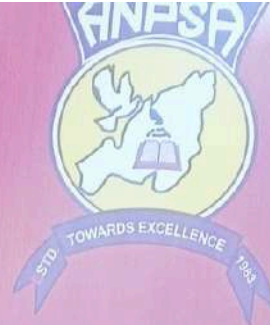
The students of St. Clare School actively participated in two major sporting events this October, showcasing their talent, determination, and team spirit.
